a seat belt, had his case continued to Dec. 10.

Eric Gilston, 19, of Greenland, N.H., charged Aug. 10 with driving under the influence of alcohol, negligent driving and driving outside lanes, admitted to driving under the influence and had the case continued one year without a finding. He must take the driver alcohol program and had his license suspended for 210 days. Negligent driving was dismissed and he was found not responsible on the lanes charge.

ON SELECTMEN

The Board of Selectmen are holding a workshop at 9 a.m. this morning, Oct. 31, in the town building conference room to discuss potential new revenue sources for the town.

Note: There will not be a regular selectmen's meeting tonight because it is the fifth Wednesday of the month. The next meeting will be Wednesday, Nov. 7 at 6 p.m. in the Town Building court room.

AT ITS MEETING ON OCT. 24, THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN FIRST CONVENE AS THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND:

- Unanimously accepted a sidewalk easement over portions of South Beach and Seas streets where Nantucket Island Resorts is building condominium hotel units.

- Unanimously ratified a determination regarding a financial interest disclosure for the Nantucket member of the Steamship Authority, H. Flint Ranney. The financial interest involves the SSA's free transportation policy for current and former Authority members and their spouses. The commissioners wrote the State Ethics Commission that it is not believed that Ranney's financial interest is substantial enough to affect his participation as an SSA board member in discussions on this policy.

CONVENING AS THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN, MEMBERS:

- Unanimously denied a request from Nantucket Airport for a waiver of a building permit fee for its terminal expansion project.

- Unanimously approved a citizen request for a waiver from street opening regulations regarding the sewer line for The House of Seven Gables on Cliff Road.

- Unanimously approved a Town Administrator's request for a vote regarding town-owned parcels at the landfill. Pursuant to a vote to pass Article 77 at the 2007 Annual Town Meeting, the selectmen voted to maintain custody of three parcels at the landfill owned by the town and merge them as a single parcel for zoning purposes. The property is being used for solid waste disposal.

- Unanimously approved a request for clarification of language regarding pending legislation approved at the 2007 Annual Town Meeting. One bill relates to allowing the town and Nantucket Land Bank to release and transfer their property interests to each other, in particular with regard to a 60 acre area near Bunker Road. The second bill allows the town to convey an easement over 43 Eel Point Road to 39 Eel Point Road for access and utilities, in exchange for an easement for public access to the beach.

Kevin Stanton, 18, of 20 Somerset Road, charged July 23 with drug possession, paid due costs and had his case dismissed.

Parker N. Swift, 26, of Boston, Mass., charged July 2 with driving under the influence of alcohol, negligent driving, driving outside lanes and speeding, had his case continued to Dec. 10.

Nigel J. Timms, 49, of Texas, charged Sept. 1 with driving under the influence of alcohol, driving outside lanes and not wearing a seat belt, had his case continued to Nov. 13.

Timothy A. Trudel, 22, of 11 Mizzenmast Road, charged Oct. 13 with driving under the influence of alcohol, with an open container of alcohol and outside marked lanes, had his case continued to Nov. 13.

Brett T. Watts, 24, of 4 Althea Lane, charged Dec. 9, 2006 with cocaine distribution and conspiracy to violate the drug law, had his case continued to Nov. 13.

Mark R. Whitcomb, 48, of Nantucket, charged Aug. 29, 2005 with driving with a suspended license and drug possession, and probation violation stemming from Aug. 7, 2006 charges of breaking and entering to commit a felony and larceny under \$250, had his cases continued to Nov. 5.

Kenneth E. White, 49, of Sandwich, Mass., charged March 31 with drug possession with intent to distribute, had his case continued to Nov. 13. A motion to suppress evidence in the case was denied.

Fred E. Wilson, 38, of 3B Cynthia Lane, charged Sept. 20 with drug possession with intent to distribute, driving with a suspended license and a lights violation, had his case continued to Dec. 17.
