## ON SELECTMEN

AT ITS MEETING ON MARCH 12, CONVENING  
AS THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN:

- Approved a request from the Nantucket District Boy Scouts of America for a waiver from building permit fees for the construction of a shower house and new restroom facility.
- Approved a request for a waiver for street opening regulations for the Great Harbor Yacht Club.
- Accepted a gift from the Great Harbor Yacht Club of a sidewalk along Washington St. Ext.
- Heard a proposal regarding de-watering regulations. Department of Public Works Director Jeff Willett informed the board that the work group charged with simplifying the regulations had drawn up a new permit that would have the various boards and committees involved all on one application to be heard at one time.
- Heard a presentation from Sustainable Nantucket on the advantages of the town joining the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI) – Climate Protection Program. The program costs \$600 to join, but makes numerous grants available to the town to save money through programs such as fleet maintenance and fuel efficiency audits. Sustainable Nantucket had a selectman from Kingston, N.H., speak to the board in favor of the project.
- Established a Downtown Revitalization Committee.
- Established a Road Surfacing Policy Work Group.
- Established a Teen Center Work Group
- Voted on the final warrant article endorsements, including the Harbor Overlay District. Selectman Michael Kopko wanted to go against the Planning Board recommendation to exclude the Brant Point Marine property, but his motion failed to garner a second. Selectman Brian Chadwick then made a motion, seconded by selectman Patty Roggeveen, to endorse the Planning Board recommendation, which was in favor of the project, with the Brant Point marine property excluded.
- The board also endorsed article 11, which seeks to secure funds for the proposed \$27 million Public Safety Complex at 2 Fairgrounds road.
